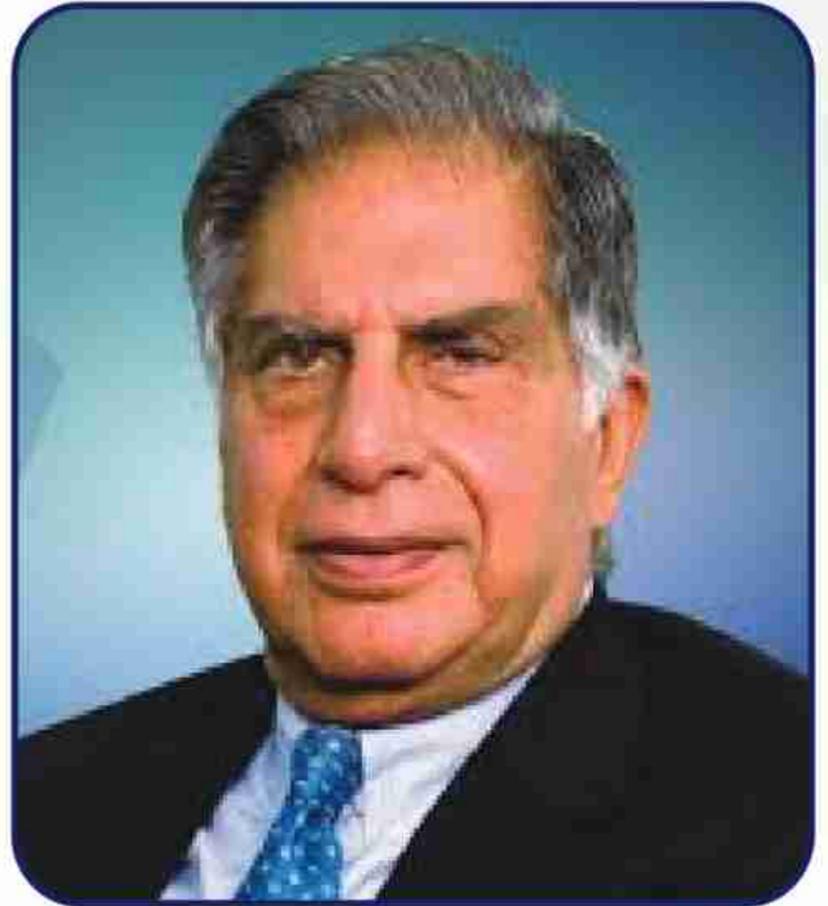

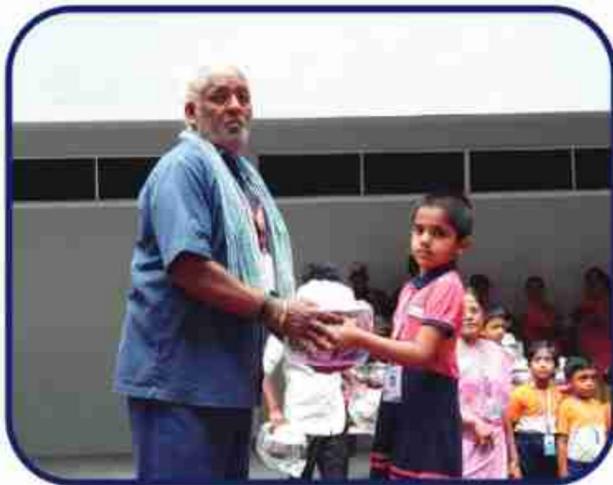
# “BUILDING BRIDGES BETWEEN HOME AND SCHOOL”

# “CELEBRATING THE SPIRIT OF REPUBLIC DAY”



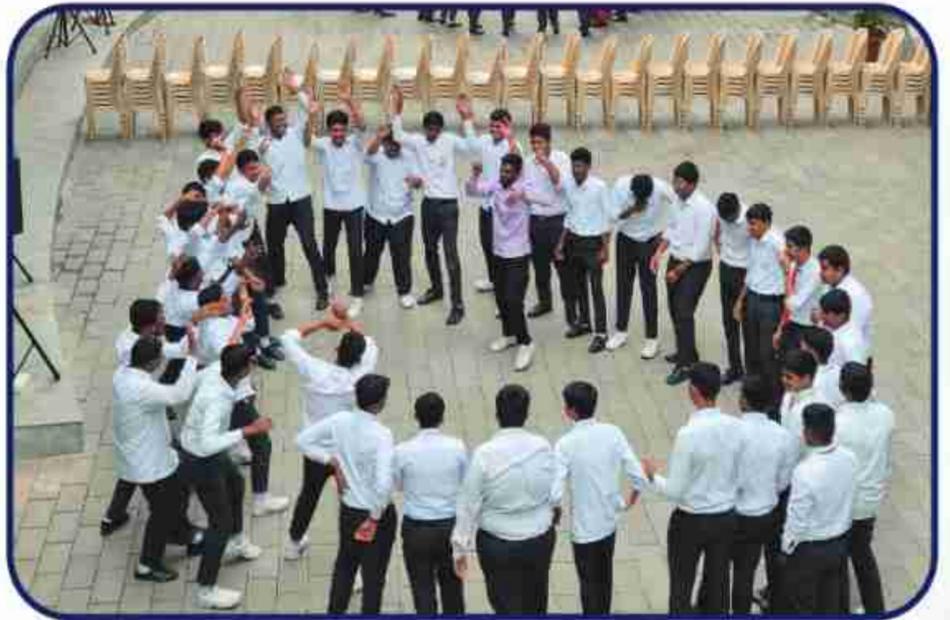
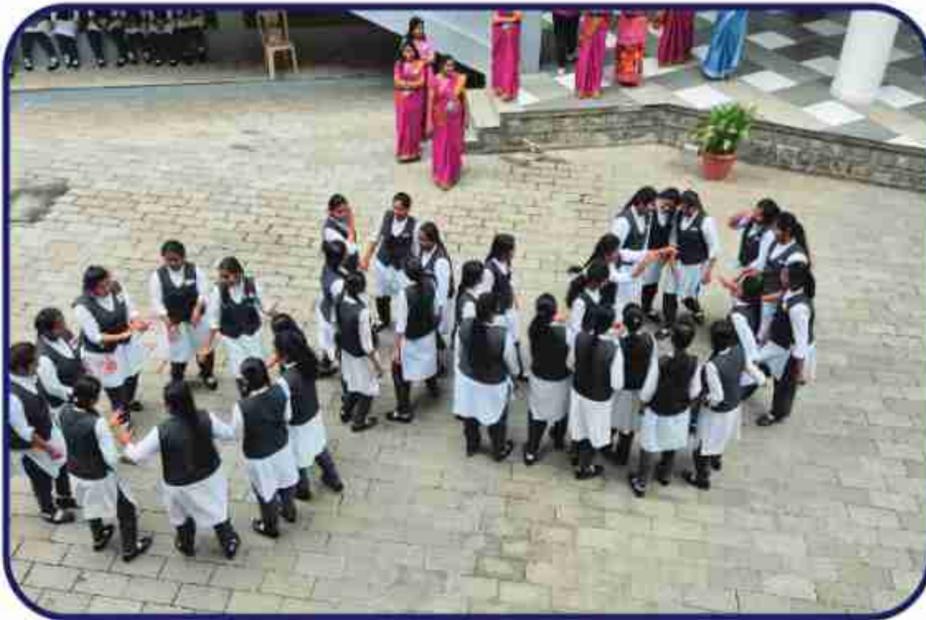

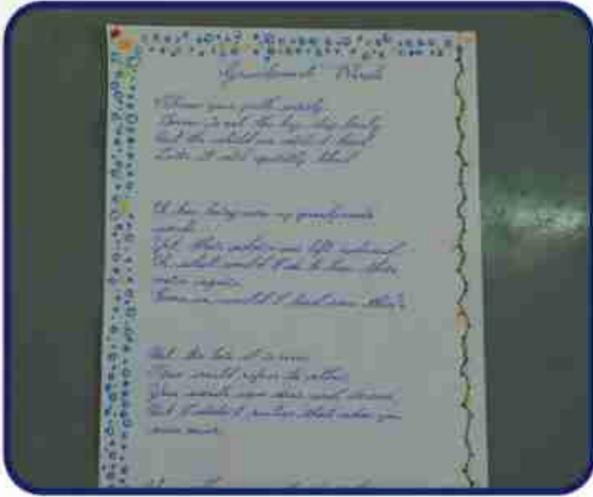
# “LEARNING BEYOND CLASSROOMS – CARNIVAL VISIT”
